

A note from Delores to Goucher...

Goucher II (that's 2 in Roman numerals) was started around 1987 (+/-) for "returning women". We took classes as a group. One semester of 4 classes went from September to April. During that time we earned 12 credits (at a cost of over \$600 a credit). After about 3 long semesters and earning about 36 credits, we went into the classrooms with the regular students. Because there was no financial aid for retuning students, we did it at our own financial and timely pace, especially since we had homes, husbands, children, and some had disabled kids and parents to take care of. Here it is:

Marge Pearce attended Goucher College, starting as a Goucher II student. She majored in Women's Studies. While she and her husband were putting their 2 daughters and herself through college, her husband passed away. She dropped out for a year. Because there were no financials for the Goucher II students, she was able to return by starting a program there.

As a member of Paint & Powder Club, she sang, danced, and performed in shows for years for the benefit of many local charities. While president, she earned thousands of dollars for children and the disabled through Paint & Powder.
