Please note that this is also the same night we will be taking pictures for the show program book at 6:30 PM.

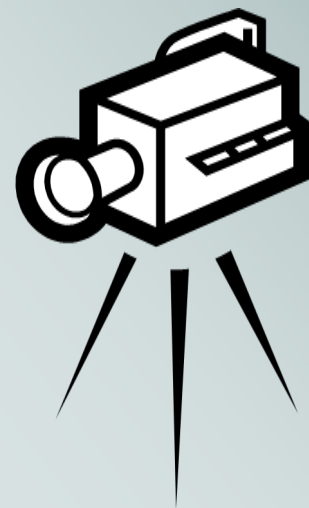
Please prepare your brief responses to the following...

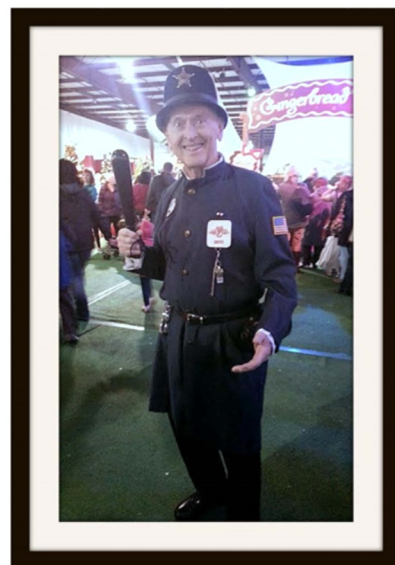
