This award program was created to publicize the Paint & Powder Club and attract new talent for our annual show which could potentially increase ticket and program sales. These new performers are also candidates for club membership.


A cover letter and two page application was sent via email by the committee members to the department head of various high schools, colleges and private studios in the Baltimore area that have a performing arts program.
