

AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS DELETING THE SECTION PROVIDING FOR THE OFFICE OF ANMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY AND ADDING A RULE AND POLICY COVERING THE FUNCTIONS OF "OTHER OFFICERS" REFERRED TO IN THE BY-LAWS

The Board of Governors, at its July, 2017 meeting, voted to amend the By-Laws by (a) deleting ARTICLE III: OFFICERS, Section 8.Administrative Secretary, and (b) adding Rule and Policy No. 3. Functions, Duties and Limitations of Other Officers.

These By-Law amendments are effective immediately; however they may be repealed or altered by the general membership at the next meeting of the members to be held on January 17 2018, at 7:30pm.







Spotlight on Rod Clark


My fraternity brother's name is Charles W. St. Clair. He came to Chicago in June 1968 to help me load up and move back to Memphis when I finished grad school at Northwestern, in Evanston, III.

A former student from Crete-Monee High School found the article (right) and Chip's picture in and old scrapbook and shared it with me via Facebook.

I started the PTA Fundraiser in March 1967 and directed the shows for two years. After I left Chicago, the Show Time Revue continued for 15 years. The net for the two years I directed these

During my years in Chicago I was a Biology teacher, freshman football coach and the varsity golf coach. I also was the Director of Student Affairs. But, I do tend to goon and on!"


ACT IV





