THE PAINT AND POWDER CLUB, INC. MAY ESTABLISH THE FOLLOWING COMMITTEES:

Budget and Finance Committee

The Budget and Finance Committee is responsible for developing an annual budget for the P&P. The President shall appoint a Finance Committee, which shall be composed of the Treasurer and a minimum of four (4) other Members, one should be the Immediate Past President of the Board, one the Director of the Budget and one shall be the Treasurer of P&P. Additional Members shall be members in good standing. This Committee shall, in accordance with such procedures as may be established by the Board of Governors, recommend a budget to the Board of Governors for the ensuing fiscal period which will provide sufficient funding for each event based on previous experience of and anticipated income to support the event. The Director of the Budget should review, with the Treasurer, all plans and status of income prior to and immediately following the event.

Social Business Committees

The Social Business Committees shall plan the schedule, budget, activities, fund-raising activities and arrangements venues (sites), caterer, if necessary, and other expenses related to the activity. The complete budget with sources of income and all expenses associated with the even shall be submitted to the budget committee for inclusion in the Paint and Powder Club Annual budget. Business Committees

The Business Committees shall explore possible venues which can accommodate the anticipated attendance, schedule, budget, social activities, fund-raising activities and arrangements for site, caterer, if necessary, and other expenses related to the activity. The complete budget with sources of income and all expenses associated with the even shall be submitted to the budget committee for inclusion in the Paint and Powder Club Annual budget.

- 1. Developing a plan for advertising solicitation for the Annual Production Program,
- 2. Developing a solicitation plan for Sponsors, Donors, Benefactors, Patron, etc.
- 3. Scholarship solicitation,
- 4. Establish rules, prices and payouts for raffles, 50-50 Raffles and other solicitations

Membership/Mailing

The membership committee has a two-fold responsibility, Recruiting and attracting new members and maintaining an accurate roster of current members. In addition, the committee shall maintain a mailing list of "Friends of Paint and Powder" who have attended events and the annual production. The committee should invite potential members to attend events and participate on the annual production.

Promotion/Social Media Development/ Newsletter

The members of this committee and the editors for the newsletter, web master and social media coordinator shall be appointed by the President. The editor should produce, with the assistance of owners, a quarterly newsletter for the members with information about upcoming meetings, special events, special occasions and an update of the bi-monthly Board meeting and committee activities. The webmaster shall maintain the current information of the website and the social media, Facebook, YouTube, twitter, Eventbrite etc.

Production Venue/Site Selection

Select potential venues for the Annual Production. Develop the

requirements necessary for mounting a production in any particular venue. Develop the mutually acceptable contract with the principles of the venue. Present the recommendation for adoption by the Club's Board of Governors.

Charity Selection

The committee shall develop a list of potential recipients of the proceeds from the Annual Production. Review and revise the expectations of the selected organization. Present the recommended organizations to the Club's Board of Governors for adoption. This should be completed by November I, each year.

Production Tickets/Associated Activities

Once the venue for the Annual Production has been selected this committee has the task of developing the seating for the event, deciding on the menu, handling box office duties on the days of the performances and special preview rehearsals, collecting tickets at the venue and other responsibilities associated with the event of the Annual Production.

Costumes

The Costume Committee, in conjunction with the Production Director and the Production Committee, shall design, select and coordinate the development of all costumes for the annual production. This committee will maintain, store and protect the costume inventory. Design and fit costumes on the show cast and assemble accessories for the costumes.

Production

The Production Committee in conjunction with the Production Director shall assist is making arrangements for the rehearsal space and venue for the production. Once the Site Selection Committee has made their recommendations for venues and costs and this has the approval of the Board of Governors members of this committee shall oversee that these facilities are protected and maintained in accordance with the rental agreements. The committee shall coordinate the development of the set, properties, costumes, lighting and audio equipment and engineers for the annual production. Assist, at the request of the Stage Manager, in the rehearsal process and tech week activities. Coordinate the cast participation in auditions and rehearsals.

Long Range Planning

The President shall appoint a committee chair and members of the committee. The Long-Range Committee is responsible for recommending a 3-Year Long-Range Plan who will recommend to the incoming President and Board of Governors venues for events, production, membership expansion, promotion and media/social networking plans.

The Long-Range Planning Committee should utilize the survey information, feed-back from other members of the Club, audience and non-member participants at Club events and productions. The plan shall be approved and adopted by the Board when the Budget is developed and the report should be revised annually and submitted to support the next year's budgeting process.

Nominating and Elections Committee

An Elections Committee shall be appointed on an annual basis by the President of the Board of Governors, expressly for the sole purpose of managing the complete elections process from call for nominations for candidates for Board vacancies through the certification of the results of the election, as held in conjunction with the Club's Annual Meeting. The committee should develop a ballot counting system to ensure confidentiality and accuracy of the election process. The Club's bylaws delineate the procedure for the selection of candidates for the Board of Governors.

The Committee, in accordance with the Bylaws, shall be appointed at least 30 days in advance of the Club's Annual Meeting. The Election Committee Chair will convene the first meeting of the Committee within 14 days of the appointment. The President and the Chair shall select a Vice Chair and at least four other members in good standing who are not candidates for the Board of Governors.

COMMITTEE GENERAL INFORMATION

Appointment and Terms

The Paint and Powder Club (P&P) President shall appoint interested members to serve on the various committees. Committee Chairs may make recommendations for the President to appoint to specific committees. Recruitment of candidates may be done through the newsletter, word of mouth, announcement at the annual meeting, or by any other means deemed appropriate by the Board of Governors. Committee members in good standing are eligible for reappointment.

Removal and Dissolution

The Board may remove any committee member, including the chairperson, at any time, without cause. Such removal may be immediate, at the President's recommendation and the majority of the Board of Governor's sole discretion.

Meetings

Committee meetings shall be open to all P&P members in good standing. In order for the members to be reasonably informed of Committee meetings, the Committee chairperson shall ensure that all meetings of the Committee are listed in the newsletter and through any other means of posting that the Committee deems appropriate. If it is necessary for the

Committee to reschedule or cancel a meeting, the Committee chairperson shall notify the committee members so that the members can be reasonably notified no less than two days before the schedule meeting. The Committee Chairperson shall be responsible for contacting the members of the Committee regarding rescheduled or canceled meetings. The Committee Chairperson shall establish the agenda for each meeting.

Minutes of all committee meetings must be recorded and presented the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Governors.

ALL COMMITTEE MEETINGS SHALL BE CONDUCTED GENERALLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER.


