Jerry and Eileen Chiat live in Owings Mills – Eileen donated a kidney to place her husband, Jerry, in line to receive one. Both are in their 60s and recently celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on November 3, 2018. They have participated in five kidney walks as captains of Team Jerry.

“Our Story is about LOVE & DEDICATION!”

Team Jerry is named for my husband of 50 years who is a kidney recipient. I am also a donor. Jerry received a kidney on May 24, 2012, and paying it forward. I donated a kidney on August 22, 2012. Our surgeries took place at the University of Maryland Medical Center. When Jerry stopped dialysis for his transplant, we were able to get our lives back to where

they were before he got sick.

We ask everyone we know by e-mail, I phone or mail to support our Kidney Walk team each year. We hold a fundraiser at Basta Pasta where they donate a percentage of the evening's earnings for Team Jerry. For Jerry's first kidney birthday, we gave him a surprise party, and everyone donated to Team Jerry instead of giving gifts.

The Chiats are active volunteers in their community and volunteer mostly together. In addition to volunteering with the National Kidney Foundation through a variety of events and committees, they are ambassadors for Donate Life and the Living Legacy Foundation of Maryland and are active with the Transplant Recipient Inter-



national Organization. They also serve on the president's council at the University of Maryland. They have helped children with disabilities, are active in the Paint and Powder Club and volunteer in Beth Israel Congregation's kitchen.

As the manager of von Arx Wildlife Hospital at the Conservancy of Southwest Florida, Jonee cares for approximately 3,800 native birds, mammals, and reptiles admitted to the hospital each year. CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF MARY ANN WARREN

1945—2018

"Mary Ann Warren, a homemaker who performed in local community theater, died Sunday from complications of Alzheimer's disease and a stroke at Springwell Senior Living in Mount Washington. She was 73. The former Mary Ann Rauch, who was born and raised in New Orleans, was the daughter of Bernard J. Rauch, a businessman, and his wife, Marguerite Rauch, a homemaker. She was a graduate of the Holy Name of Jesus Mercy Academy in New Orleans and earned a bachelor's degree in 1968 from the University of Virginia. Ms. Warren moved to Baltimore in 1968, and after teaching English for several years at Archbishop Keough High School, earned her real estate license and worked for O'Connor, Piper & Flynn until 1978, family members said. An accomplished actress, dancer, and singer, Mrs. Warren performed in local community theater and for years was a mainstay of the Paint & Powder Club. Mrs. Warren, who had been a longtime Mount Washington resident before moving to Springwell two years ago, was a former member of the Gibson Island Club. She enjoyed sailing the Chesapeake Bay and was an avid Orioles fan. She was a huge Cal Ripken fan and collected anything Cal Ripken, said her son Richard Henry "Hank" Mitchell, a resident of the city's Lake Montebello neighborhood. A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. January 5 at Christ Lutheran Church, 701 S. Charles St., Federal Hill. In addition to her son, she is survived by her husband of 19 years, Edward "Buzz" Warren, a retired senior project manager for Navy Supply Systems; a brother, Bernard J. Rauch of Chatham, Mississippi; a sister, Diane Rauch Kern, of New Orleans, and a grandson. An earlier marriage to Geoffrey S. Mitchell, a lawyer, ended in divorce." Frederick N. Rasmussen
